Is there anything else the SSPBT should know about what has happened in your program since the 2011-12 APRU?	<p>In May of 2013 the new DSM-V will be released and will have a single diagnostic category, “autism spectrum disorders” that will incorporate the current diagnoses of autistic disorders, Asperger Syndrome, childhood disintegrative disorder and pervasive developmental disorder not otherwise specified. This means that more students will be eligible for Regional Center services based on this category. Before students diagnosed with Asperger Syndrome were denied eligibility for Regional Center services. The San Andreas Regional Center expects a very large increase in referrals with clients with Asperger Syndrome and is concerned about the limited resources currently available to these adults.</p> <p>We are working with UCLA’s Tarjan Center to get the best ideas and tools to start serving this newer population of students. More students on the autism spectrum are anticipated to be referred to our Hope programs this summer and believe that an intermediary program before stepping onto the campus is critical for the success of these students.</p> <p>The ongoing reduction in staff is reducing the strength and effectiveness of our programs and services. We are at accredited (CARF) Hope sites and always includes in their final reports that De Anza College provides exceptional programming for its clientele. Enrollments at our sites are not declining. As the campus wants to increase enrollment enrollment is growing. We have a new course for Spring 2013...232z. We will be starting an SLO cycle for that the first week of the quarter. Have you completed a SLOAC in 2012 – 13?	Yes....we have completed a cycle in each of the two courses mentioned. For SLO#1 230z, our target was that 70% of the students will be able to identify vocational interest and that 50% of the students will have taken steps to develop their vocational interest. The outcome was that 80% of the students were able to identify their vocational interests and that 45% of the students have taken steps develop their vocational interest. 	For SLO#1 231z, our target was that 70% of the students will identify and demonstrate proficiency in one or more workplace skills related to career goals. The outcome was that 36% of the students from the focus group identified and demonstrated proficiency in one or more workplace skills to their career goals.

We need to get back those IA positions that were cut to reduce the strain on the faculty instructors and to be able to give students the individual attention and services necessary to be successful in meeting their individual SEC goals.
