Knowledge of common phrases (Muhavare) used in the everyday language.

Ability to comprehend and use them in everyday conversations. Ability to

understand and appreciate poetry. Particularly verses of Kabir (Kabir Ke

Dohe). Also ability to discuss the same in a group setting.

Knowledge of Indian Festivals, Indian culture and Indian foods. Familiarity

with the historic and/or mythological basis for Indian festivals. Knowledge

of and ability to practice day-to-day Indian customs such as greetings,

household conventions etc. Ability to role-play simple situations in an

almost extempore manner.
